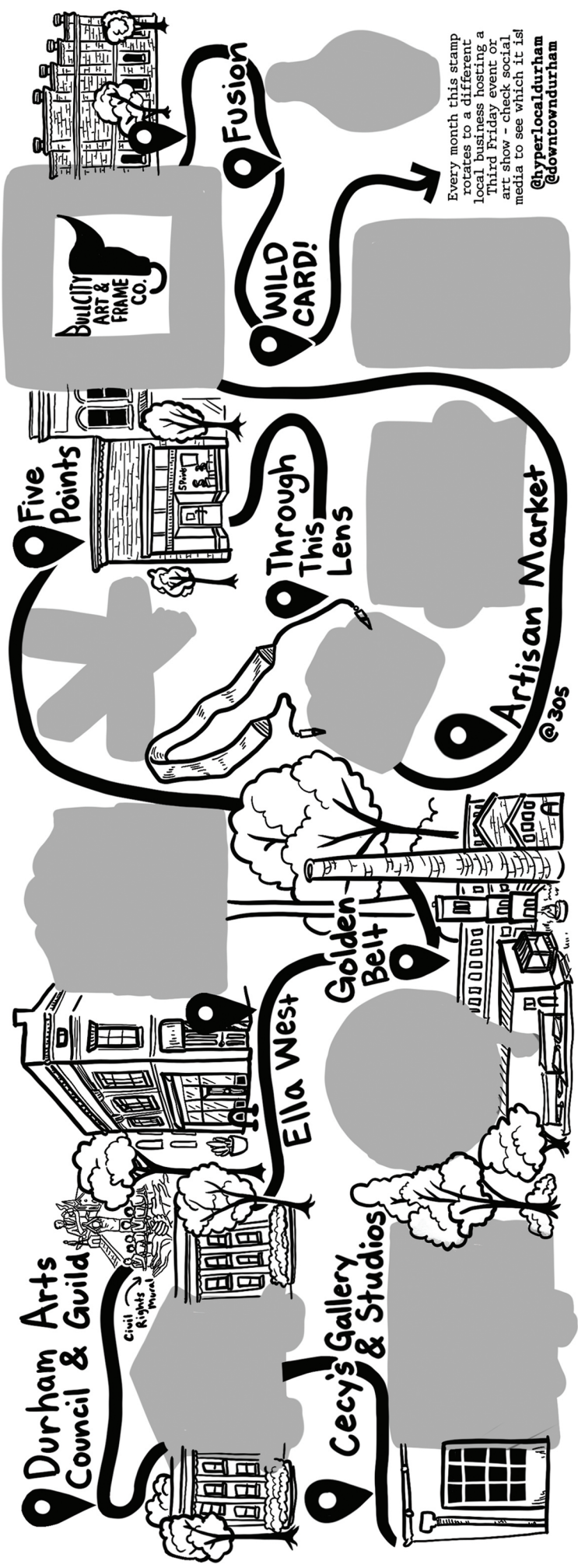


Every month this stamp rotates to a different local business hosting a Third Friday event or art show - check social media to see which it is!

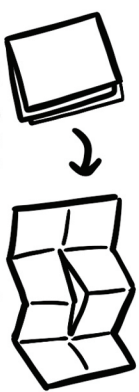

You can find the Liberty Arts metal foundry in Durham Central Park. It's the only nonprofit casting facility on the East Coast and preserves the Durham's industrial legacy through events like the annual Iron Pour!

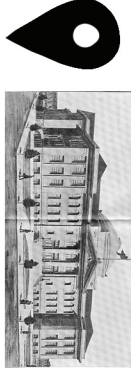

Cecy's

A vibrant studio-gallery known for its craft workshops and diverse range of handmade gifts and art crafted by local creatives.

This storied space was originally constructed as the first city high school in 1906. It was later remodeled when the Carolina Theatre (then Durham Auditorium) was grafted onto it and became City Hall. In 1978, a group of performance and visual arts guilds came together to breathe new life into the space, cementing it as the city's main creative hub dedicated to art shows and art education.



Golden Belt

The Golden Belt warehouse boasts 25 individual artist studios! The stamp for this gallery is a reference to the warehouses former life as Golden Belt Manufacturing Co. a textile mill producing drawstring bags for tobacco and cotton hosiery - seen here on the cover of Golden Belt Magazine.



The Artisan Market at 305

This is a collective shop featuring handcrafted works and Durham-inspired goods of more than 45 artisans. The stamp represents the physical shop at 305 E Chapel Hill St, where the historic Palms Restaurant (est. 1932) used to be, known for being "the place to do business and be seen downtown" during its 50 year lifespan, before eventually being converted into the Durham Arts Space and later The Artisan Market.

Five Points

Five Points Gallery is in the heart of downtown and showcases the work of 10 local contemporary artists. Their logo stamp represents Five Points literally: the intersection of Chapel Hill St, Main St, and Morris St.

Based in the historic Brightleaf Square tobacco warehouses, Bull City Art & Frame, blends old-world craftsmanship with local flair custom framing.

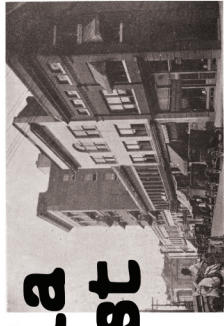
Through This Lens

Through This Lens is a gallery, framing, and printing shop for photographic art, featuring work from 50+ local, regional, and international photographers.

Fusion

Fusion Gallery is a newly reopened creative space on Main Street, offering hands-on art workshops and rotating local exhibitions that bring Durham's maker community together.

Ella West



Nestled on Parrish St, Durham's historic Black Wall Street, Ella West Gallery showcases Black and underrepresented artists. Though much of historic Black Wall Street was destroyed during urban renewal in the 60-70's, Ella West honors Parrish Street's legacy of Black excellence, reflected in this historical marker stamp.
